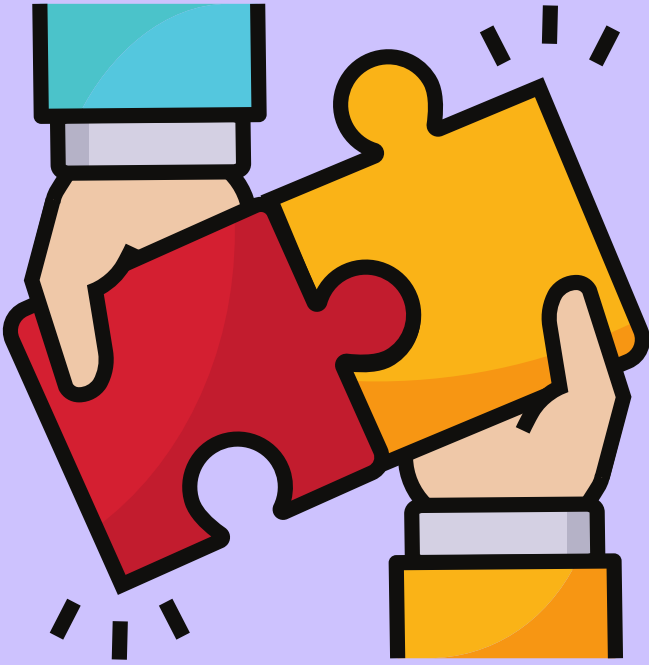

In 14-04-2018 & 25-07-2019, **Shri Sadashiva Campus, Puri has started collaboration with Ravenshaw autonomous University, Cuttack** for comparative study of Sanskrit with other subjects and languages.
